British Values	Key Stage 1	Key Stage 2
<b>Democracy</b>	Within all lessons children get the opportunity to have their opinions heard amongst their peers when discussing topics and current issues and tactics. Children are encouraged to learn about democracy and allowing everyone the opportunity to have their say. This is often seen through feedback and peer and self-analysis tasks within lessons.	
<b>Rule Of Law</b>	A key part of Physical Education lessons is about teaching children about rules, sportsmanship, etiquette and fair play. In every lesson, children abide by the rules and regulations, gaining a good understanding of rules of each sport and the importance of infringements such as penalties and red cards allow children to understand the consequences of their actions which in turn helps children apply this understanding to their own lives.	
<b>Individual Liberty</b>	Within our lessons, children are taught about self-discipline and that to be successful you must work hard, show resilience and have a growth mind-set that anything can be achieved if you put your mind to it. Leadership is another area that we look to develop within our children within lessons and extra-curricular activities. Children in year 6 have the opportunity to run activities at lunch times for younger children to take part in and present children with SPIRIT awards in Good Work Assemblies.	
<b>Mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs</b>	Students in PE use of a range of social skills in different contexts, including working and socialising with pupils from different religious, ethnic and socio-economic backgrounds. They are also taught about respecting students' different abilities and also the calls/judgements made by officials during games.
