British Values	
Democracy	Children have the opportunity to work independently and as a team to build resilience and self-esteem through tasks, sharing ideas and resources, peer-assessment and encouraging students to support each other. Children use peer assessment and listen to the views of others in a supportive manner.
Rule Of Law	Children follow the classroom rules, including rules for using and tidying equipment safely and correctly. Children follow rules for applying and using a variety of media in art. Children learn to follow rules for using equipment in design and technology such as knives for food projects or saws for wood projects and understand how rules are put in place to keep us safe.
Individual Liberty	Children are able to express themselves through art and design. Children are able to give reasons why they have chosen to use a particular image or media. Children express views and opinions on the work of famous artists. Final pieces of art are individual and show individual children's expression. Children discuss the process of their work and what adjustments they have made to make it unique.
Mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs	Children are encouraged to look at art in different cultures and religions -Rangoli patterns, Myan art etc Children respect all opinions when discussing art; Peer evaluation and discussion is respectful. Sharing different people's ideas that may be built on cultural diversity enable children to widen their understanding of culture. Children develop an understanding how different art and media have been used in a variety of cultures.
