British Values	
Democracy	<p>One aspect of school council are the Play Leaders who lead sports and games within the school.</p> <p>Children choose sports and active games at breaktimes.</p> <p>Within all lessons children get the opportunity to have their opinions heard amongst their peers when discussing topics and current issues and tactics.</p> <p>Children are encouraged to learn about democracy and allowing everyone the opportunity to have their say. This is often seen through feedback and peer and self-analysis tasks within each sport.</p>
Rule Of Law	<p>A key part of Physical Education lessons is about teaching children about rules, sportsmanship, etiquette and fair play. In every lesson, children abide by the rules and regulations, gaining a good understanding of rules of each sport and the importance of infringements, such as penalties, allow children to understand the consequences of their actions which in turn helps children apply this understanding to their own lives.</p>
Individual Liberty	<p>Within PE, stereotypes are challenged with a particular focus on gender stereotypes in sport.</p> <p>Children are taught about self-discipline and that to be successful you must work hard, show resilience and have a growth mind-set that anything can be achieved if you put your mind to it.</p> <p>Leadership is another area that we look to develop within our children within lessons and extra-curricular activities. Children in year 6 have the opportunity to run activities at lunch times for younger children.</p>
Mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs	<p>Elkesley Primary and Nursery School work closely with Tuxford Academy and attend interschool sport events where children work with children from a range of schools and differing backgrounds.</p> <p>Children use of a range of social skills in different contexts, including working and socialising with pupils from different religious, ethnic and socio-economic backgrounds.</p> <p>Children are taught about respecting different abilities.</p>
